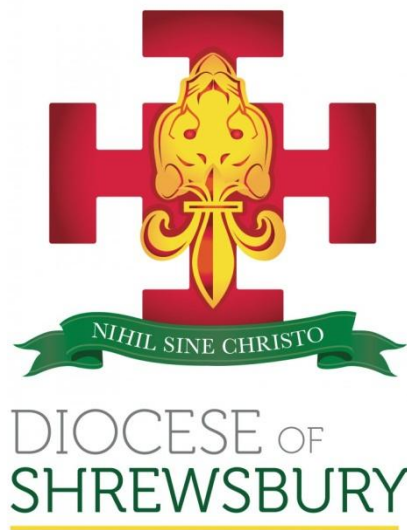

The integration of culture and faith is mediated by the other integration of faith and life in the person of the teacher. The nobility of the task to which teachers are called demands that, in imitation of Christ, the only Teacher, they reveal the Christian message not only by word but also by every gesture of their behaviour. This is what makes the difference between a school whose education is permeated by Christian spirit and one in which religion is only regarded as an academic subject like any other.

The Catholic school loses its purpose without constant reference to the Gospel and a frequent encounter with Christ. It derives all the energy necessary for its educational work from Him and thus creates in the school community an atmosphere permeated with the Gospel spirit of freedom and love. In this setting the pupil experiences their dignity as a person before they know its definition.'

We wish you all another rich and successful year of great blessings for 2025-26, assured of our continued prayers for your school communities.

5. CANONISATION OF BLESSED CARLO ACUTIS AND BLESSED PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI

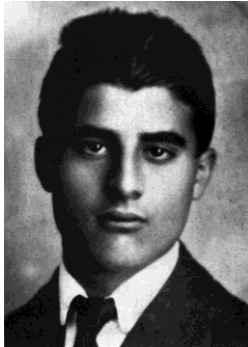

Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati and Blessed Carlo Acutis will be the first saints proclaimed by Pope Leo on 7th September.

The canonization of Blessed Acutis, a teenager known for his devotion to the Eucharist and creating an online exhibition of Eucharistic miracles, had originally been scheduled for April 27 during the Jubilee of Teenagers but was postponed following the death of Pope Francis.



Born in 1991 and raised in Milan, Blessed Acutis used his tech skills to evangelize and was noted for his joyful faith and compassion for others before dying of leukemia in 2006 at age 15.



Blessed Frassati, born in 1901 into a prominent family in Turin, Italy, was admired for his deep spirituality, love for the poor and enthusiasm for life. A member of the Dominican Third Order, he served the sick through the St. Vincent de Paul Society. He died at age 24 after contracting polio, possibly from one of the people he assisted.

The Season of Creation is a global ecumenical celebration of prayer and action to protect our common home which began on 1st September and finishes on the feast of St Francis, 4th October. During this season we are encouraged to pray and engage in community events in order to deepen our relationship with God, our neighbour and the earth we share, being ever more attentive to the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor.

The theme of Pope Leo XIV’s message for the *World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation* is ‘**Seeds of Peace and Hope**’. In his message for the Tenth World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, Pope Leo stresses that environmental justice – implicitly proclaimed by the prophets – can no longer be regarded as an abstract concept or a distant goal. 7. EDUCATION SUNDAY 2025

Education Sunday takes place each year on the second Sunday of September, and this year is observed on the 14th. Established by the Bishops in 1848, it is one of the oldest Days of Special Prayer in the liturgical calendar of England and Wales.

This year's theme for Education Sunday is drawn from its Gospel reading of John 3:13-17: The Son of Man must be lifted up. It takes place this year on the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Ten years ago the then-Holy Father, Pope Francis, said during his Mass for this feast that a Christian 'must lower himself, as Jesus lowered himself: this is the path of humility.' Catholic education in Church schools and universities endeavours to acknowledge Jesus' loving presence in the lives of young people as they work, learn, pray, grow in character and virtue, and discover their vocation. Education Sunday is an opportunity to showcase the works and fruits of this, especially locally.

The CES has produced resources for schools to use ahead of this year's Education Sunday, and the Rt Rev Marcus Stock, Bishop of Leeds and Chair of the CES, has written a letter to all those within Catholic education to mark the occasion. A reminder that all Governors should be using a school email address for all correspondence in relation to their role as a school governor and **not a personal email address**.

Should any parents serve as a foundation, community or co-opted governor, then we would ask that care is taken to ensure that the total number of parents does not make up more than 1/3 of the total number of governors.

As we start the new term, can I remind schools and academies that although we welcome nominations for Foundation Governors from schools and Governing Bodies, potential Governors should not assume they have been appointed as a Foundation Governor until they have received notification of their term of office in writing, as it is the Bishop that makes the final decision on this matter. Particular care needs to be taken if you are considering transferring a Governor from a previous status (e.g. Parent to a Foundation Governor) as they must be formally appointed to the position of Foundation Governor.

A reminder that a Licence Agreement is required for events organised by the school that take place within a parish church and fall outside of the usual provision of a parish church.

The Diocese has also made available a 'joint event' licence for those occasions when more than one school is involved in the same event which highlights that the schools who are signatories will be jointly and severally liable under the agreement. The Diocese suggests that the schools work on an agreed single risk assessment for the event that they are all content with, as five separate risk assessments for one event would be impractical in terms of understanding responsibilities.

On the 15th July, the DfE produced [updated statutory RSHE guidance](#) for implementation by schools in September 2026. The current guidelines remain in place for the academic year 2025-26.

Ten Ten Resources have confirmed that they will be reviewing and updating their programme in the light of the new guidance so that your school curriculum remains fit-for-purpose when the new statutory guidance comes into effect in September 2026.

THE REQUIREMENT TO CONSULT EVERY 7 YEARS

If your school has not consulted within the last 7 years, then please do so this academic year for your 2027-28 Admissions Policy.

A reminder to all schools that the 2021 Admissions Code includes the requirement that admission authorities **must** consult on their admission arrangements **at least once every 7 years**, even if there have been no changes during that period. We are aware that a number of schools may find themselves within this ‘window’ this academic year and will need to formally consult for a minimum of 6 weeks between 1st October and 31st January.

Please can schools ensure that governing boards adhere to this guidance and put in place appropriate internal and external arrangements to comply with this requirement from the Admissions Code. Full details can be found in paras 1.45-1.48 on pages 18 and 19 of the 2021 Admissions Code which can be accessed [here](#).

A reminder once again that the Diocesan Department of Education **MUST** be involved in Headship, Deputy Headship, Heads of RE and Chaplain appointments. In addition, if schools and academies are seeking to appoint to posts that have a responsibility for Catholic ethos, then again, the Diocese must be involved.

The updated 2024 *Bishops' Memorandum on the Appointment of Teachers* also extends Diocesan involvement to all **temporary** positions, including Executive Headships and Heads of School. If schools are making **temporary leadership arrangements**, they must

also have these approved by the relevant Diocesan officer and have gone through an approved recruitment process.

If schools are wishing to extend any temporary arrangements beyond existing timescales agreed with the Diocese, then please contact us at the earliest opportunity.

Please ensure that the Diocese is contacted prior to any recruitment process commencing.
